**HEALTH BYTES**

**Corn Chowder – Vegan (gluten-free)**

- |  |                                      |
|--|--------------------------------------|
| 1 T. Olive Oil                                 | ¼ c chopped fresh parsley            |
| 1 green onion, chopped (white part only)       | ¼ t. ground cumin                    |
| 1 small onion                                  | 1 c. water                           |
| 2 c. peeled, seeded and diced butternut squash | 1 t. seal salt                       |
| 2 red potatoes, scrubbed, peeled, and cubed    | ¼ - ½ t. freshly ground black pepper |
| 2 cloves garlic                                | 2 T. curry powder (optional)         |
| 1 (15 oz. Can) light coconut milk              |                                      |
| 2 c frozen or fresh white or yellow corn       |                                      |

Heat the oil in a large stockpot. When the oil is hot, add the leek, onion, and butternut squash. Cook for 4-5 minutes over medium heat. Add the potatoes and garlic, and continue to cook until the potatoes and squash are beginning to soften, 6 to 10 minutes. If the veggies stick to the bottom of the pot, add a drip of oil. Add the coconut milk, corn, bay leaves, parsley, cumin, and water. Simmer, covered, until flavors blend and the potatoes and squash are cooked through but not mushy. Season with salt and fresh ground pepper. If you prefer your chowder thinner, add a little more water.

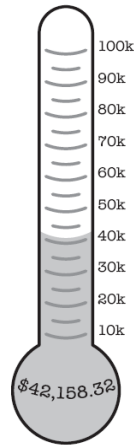
