This coming Friday, November 6, we are going to honor the life of Larry Putz. A memorial service will be held at 5:30 p.m., at Hope Lutheran Church. You are invited to stay for a dinner in the Community Center immediately following the service.

EMPLOYEE FATALLY SHOT AT CAMP CEDAR FALLS IN ANGELUS OAKS, CALIF.

On Monday, Nov. 2, 2009, a female employee of Camp Cedar Falls Conference Center in Angelus Oaks, Calif. was the victim of a fatal shooting. The retreat center is operated by the Southern California Conference of Seventh-day Adventists (SCC). The victim was Celebrada Sexton , 60, who worked in food service and housekeeping areas at the camp center. Another employee, Leith Hamilton, 30, is in police custody in connection with the incident. There were no campers present at the time of the incident. Church officials indicate that they are fully cooperating with the police investigation. "We are greatly saddened by this tragedy," said Larry Caviness, the president of the Southern California Conference. "Our hearts and prayers are with those individuals who have been affected by this event."

The facility at Cedar Falls is used for church retreats and summer programs for young people. The facility has been in operation in the San Bernardino mountains since 1941.

SUNRISE CRUNCHY GRANOLA

5 cups rolled oats

2 cups wheat flakes (or 2 more cups rolled oats)

I cup oat bran

I cup raw sunflower seeds

1/2 cup raw sesame seeds

I cup whole or sliced almonds

2 cups finely shredded unsweetened coconut

I cup water

½ cup raw cashews, well rinsed

2 cups pitted dates

Youth Pastor Fund

I can (I2 oz.) frozen unsweetened pineapple juice concentrate, thawed

2 teaspoons vanilla extract

I teaspoon almond extract

I teaspoon ground coriander

½ teaspoon sea salt

2 cups raisins (optional)

Preheat oven to 170° F. Place first seven ingredients in very large bowl and mix thoroughly. Make the fruit cream: Place remaining ingredients, except for raisins, in blender and blend for several minutes until creamy. Mix blended fruit cream with dry ingredients until they are lightly and evenly moistened. (It is best to use your hands for this!) Spread mixture in three large baking dishes about I inch deep. Place the pans in the oven before bedtime. The granola will be ready at sunrise and the house will smell delicious! Toss raisins together with granola after removing from oven. Makes 40 servings.— add a few peaches and enjoy!





God's Great Mission

an excerpt from "Overcoming Your Shadow Mission" by John Ortberg

Here is the great news: our little missions are part of a much bigger mission. They are part of God's great mission that has been sealed by something far more powerful than our gifts or even our character.

Just look at what was going on behind the scenes in the book of Esther. Esther, as you may know, is the only book in the Old Testament that never mentions God, but in reality He's the main character in the story.

There is a law that's unalterable in this story. There is a will that will not be turned, bit it ain't the law of the Medes or the Persians. How is it that, of all the women in the empire, a young Jewish woman named Esther becomes queen? How is it that, of all the people in the empire, Mordecai should be the one who saves the king from an assassination plot? How is it that the king should have insomnia on very night that Haman builds a gallows for Mordecai—[and] of all the stories, the one read to the king was the one of Mordecai saving his life? How is it that Haman, the scheming murderer, becomes the victim of his own schemes, and Mordecai, his intended victim, becomes instead his replacement? How is it that the king's ring, given to Haman, ends up on Mordecai's finger? How did the noose intended for Mordecai end up around Haman's neck? How is it that the people who marked the Jews for destruction are themselves destroyed?

The writer wants us to know that even in exile, as God's people were then—with no Jerusalem, no temple, no Sanhedrin—God is present. Unseen, unnamed, He is at work behind the scenes, and His purpose is certain.
