PASTOR'S NOTES

CHURCH VOTES TO KEEP BUILDING

Last Saturday night, the Sunnyside church in business session, voted unanimously to finish the renovation of our new church even though the building fund is depleted. The decision was made to borrow the remaining funds needed to get us into the facility. The motion that was passed reads as follows:

"VOTED - To pursue with all dispatch, the completion of the renovation of the Maroa church property and building. The church in business session instructs the finance committee of the church to apply for the maximum amount of funds available through a loan from the Pacific Union Conference funds (Revolving fund or such other funds that may be available). It further directs the finance committee to complete the application to the California Adventist Federal Credit Union for a line of credit in order to continue to fund the renovation project while the application to the Pacific Union Conference funds is in process. It further directs the treasurer to extinguish the California Adventist Federal Credit Union credit line upon any funding of a loan from the Pacific Union Conference fund. The church in business session also asks the finance committee to pursue the availability of unsecured loans from interested parties. The church in business session authorizes the additional borrowings from all sources to total no more than \$625,000.00. It is further understood from the construction supervisor that expenditures totaling no more than \$500,000.00 will allow the church to occupy the premises for worship. The church in business session also understands that a \$784,000.00 loan already exists and is secured by a first trust deed on the property."

CHURCH OFFICES MOVING

The office section in our new church will soon be complete enough to allow Angela, Calvin and me to occupy it. We are expecting to move the church office from our current location in the next week or two. This will allow us to stop paying monthly rent on the church offices and use that money for the new church.

HEALTHY BYTES



MORE ON OLIVE OIL: Ninety percent of the fats in olive oil are the heart-healthy, cholesterol-lowering monounsaturated type, which acts like a sponge to suck up LDL cholesterol.

Olive oil is a top synergy food, meaning that when it's added to other foods, especially vegetables, it increases the absorption of nutrients, allowing antioxidants, such as lycopene in

tomatoes and the beta-carotene in carrots, to be more easily absorbed by the body.

While olive oil is healthy, it's also high in calories. Try to limit intake to one tablespoon, 125 calories, per day.

It started with the Civil War....

Memorial Day was a response to the unprecedented carnage of the Civil War, in which some 620,000 soldiers on both sides died. The loss of life and its effect on communities throughout the North and South led to spontaneous commemorations of the dead:

- In 1864, women from Boalsburg, Pennsylvania, put flowers on the graves of their dead from the just-fought Battle of Gettysburg. The next year, a group of women decorated the graves of soldiers buried in a Vicksburg, Mississippi, cemetery.
- In April 1866, women from Columbus, Mississippi, laid flowers on the graves of both Union and Confederate soldiers. It was recognized at the time as an act of healing regional wounds. In the same month, up in Carbondale, Illinois, 219 Civil War veterans marched through town in memory of the fallen to Woodlawn Cemetery, where Union hero Maj. Gen. John A. Logan delivered the principal address. The ceremony gave Carbondale its claim to the first organized, community-wide Memorial Day observance.
- Waterloo, New York., began holding an annual community service on May 5, 1866. Although many towns claimed the title, it was Waterloo that won congressional recognition as the "birthplace of Memorial Day."

Gen. Logan, the speaker at the Carbondale gathering, also was commander of the Grand Army of the Republic, an organization of Union veterans. On May 5, 1868, he issued General Orders No. 11, which set aside May 30, 1868, "for the purpose of strewing with flowers, or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country during the late rebellion...." The orders expressed hope that the observance would be "kept up from year to year while a survivor of the war remains to honor the memory of his departed comrades."

From the practice of decorating graves with flowers, wreaths and flags, the holiday was long known as Decoration Day. The name Memorial Day goes back to 1882, but the older name didn't disappear until after World War II. Federal law declared "Memorial Day" the official name in 1967.
