ADVENT 3: KEEPIN' IT REAL

There was a man sent from God, whose name was John...he himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.

— John 1:6-9

In the Gospel reading for this week, John the Baptist is keepin' it real—about who he is and who he is not. Who Jesus is and what his coming brings to our world. What distracts and what is really true from a spiritual point of view. This is never easy. During this season we wander somewhere between high hopes and deep dread...longing for connection and profound loneliness...generosity of spirit and poverty of soul. We kill ourselves to keep up with what the season requires while dying on the inside.

Especially as we get further and further into the Christmas season, we have trouble discerning the spiritual meaning of things. True enlightenment is just beyond our reach.

The practice of observing Advent reminds us that in a culture full of clutter and distraction, we seek to make room for what is essential. In a season frantic with consumerism and superficial sentiments, we are committed to creating space for what is real. In hearts driven to distraction by a multitude of cares and concerns, we do whatever it takes to "prepare the way" for some sort of meaningful connection with Christ.

In the wilderness of spiritual emptiness that often characterizes this season, we join John the Baptist in "keepin' it real" by proclaiming our faith in what is true.

Advent Credo

It is not true that creation and the human family are doomed to destruction and loss—This is true: For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son, That whoever believes in him shall not perish, but have everlasting life.

It is not true that we must accept inhumanity and discrimination, hunger and poverty, death and destruction — This is true: I have come that they may have life, and that abundantly...


WOMEN'S FRIENDSHIP CIRCLE ON HOLIDAY BREAK



Lessons from Winston by John Ortberg

More than a decade ago, I brought our kids home from camp, and Nancy was sitting in the front yard with a tiny Yorkshire terrier puppy.

We did not have a good pet track record. I will say no more on this front. I asked Nancy-"Did we actually agree that we were getting a dog?" "We must have," she said, 'because there is a dog."

We called him Winston (after Churchill) because he was all attitude. He would bark at anything that approached the house, tho he would not have known what to do in hand-to-hand combat. He loved turning around in circles. He walked patrol.

Our kids loved it when we would hold him above a pool or any body of water – he would start swimming when he was still being held three feet up in the air.

For more than a decade he was there to send them off to school and greet them when they came home; to go for a walk when they were lonely, to console them when they were sad. He wasn't big or strong or even particularly bright. He was just ours. He died last night. He went in for ACL surgery, but did not respond well to the anesthesia.

So the last half day has been filled with remembering and laughing and crying over all that a dog means—unconditional affection; constant companionship, the light in the eyes of small children, the heart of a family. And three lessons from Winston:

- Real love can never be earned, only given.
- Gratitude is not an obligation but a privilege and a gift.
- God must be good beyond all imagining, to think up a world of animals that bring so much joy and delight and affection.

How many are your works, O Lord!

In wisdom you made them all.

The earth is full of your creatures...

These all look to you to give them their food at the proper time.

When you give it to them, they gather it up;

when you open your hand, they are satisfied with good things.

When you hide your face, they are terrified;

when you take away their breath,

they die and return to dust.

When you send your Spirit, they are created,

and you renew the face of the earth.
